Policy Statement

The South Four Soccer Association is dedicated to upholding the principles of fairness, inclusion, and safety in sports. Compliance with the Fairness and Safety in Sport Act is mandatory for all CMSA members.

1. Gender Identity, Registration & Eligibility Confirmation

Any athlete aged 12 years or older registering for female, male, or co-ed competitions must provide written verification of their eligibility at the time of registration, as required by the Fairness and Safety in Sport Act.

2. Athlete Eligibility Declaration

By checking this box, I affirm my eligibility to participate in female, male, or co-ed competitions under Alberta's Fairness and Safety in Sport Act (Bill C-29).

I confirm that my sex assigned at birth, as recorded on my birth registration document, is female.

I understand that this declaration may be subject to be reviewed in the event of a formal eligibility complaint and that knowingly submitting false information may result in disciplinary action.
